From Maui to Inner Mongolia By Laura Newell

Out of the blue one day I received a letter from a group I'd never heard of (English Language Institute of China), asking me to consider teaching English in China. My first thought was "How in the world did they ever get my name and address?" I'm still not sure.

Because I'd been in a near fatal car wreck a few years prior to that and still hadn't fully recovered, I didn't really think that invitation was for me. However, instead of tossing it into file 13, I put it into my classroom filing cabinet and forgot about it. A year later I received a second invitation and my interest was piqued.

My paternal grandfather and his three siblings were born and raised in Japan; his parents had ministered in both Korea and Japan but mostly in Japan. Can you imagine a red-headed, blue eyed American missionary fluent in Japanese back in the late eighteenth century? That was my great-grandpa.

I grew up with quite a few reminders: twin rocking chairs that folded up, a large Korean brass chest (my brother and I were taught exactly how to shine), as well as various pictures on the wall.

In getting that second invitation I flashed on all that, and the Lord gave me a strong desire to teach English in China. So, I contacted ELIC and they asked me what province I'd prefer. Really? I didn't even know China had provinces.

So, I responded, "Wherever I'm needed." That's how I ended up in the belly of the beast: Inner Mongolia. That province is to China what Siberia is to Russia; it's where political

enemies of the state end up. Of course, I didn't know that before I left Maui. In fact, there wasn't much I did know, so I got information to contact a woman who had taught at the school where I was headed. My, oh, my, what an earful I got!

I learned from her about the impossible year she and a colleague had, the first year ELIC had foreign teachers there; in fact, the two of them were not invited to return. She informed me that the head of the Foreign Experts Department was a most unsavory fellow. They nicknamed him 'the snake.' And his wife? She was certifiably crazy. On and on 'til I wondered why in the world the Lord was sending me there.

Maybe the whole thing was a huge mistake. As I wrestled with God in prayer, I came away with just two words: love and respect. Sounded pretty simple, but that was my assignment from my Father. I knew that message was from Him, so I left Maui for Nei Mongol. I went and they were some of the best years of my life, learning how to depend on God's Spirit. I'm still learning.

Also, a number of PBC's Fellowship have reached out to be trained and deployed to assist traumatized and grieving people through the Crisis Care Ministry. Following the example of the Good Samaritan has been a difficult but rewarding Ministry and I thank each of you.

This is an Awesome group of Followers of JESUS gathered at PBC. Many have found "A Second Chance" in JESUS here. I have heard many outstanding testimonies of how Jesus came into their lives and led them to this Loving Fellowship of Believers at PBC. Thank you, Heavenly Father for bringing me here.
