Rest of the Story By Laura Newell

Horatio Spafford, author of the well-known and loved hymn "It Is Well With My Soul," lived an eventful life. Born in 1828 in Troy, NY, he became an attorney, businessman, and elder in Fullerton Avenue Presbyterian Church. He also served as director of finances in that fellowship.

In 1861 he moved to Chicago and married Anna Larson of Norway, with whom he had four daughters. The Great Chicago Fire occurred Oct. 8, 1871 - 300 people died, 1,000 homeless - and destroyed much of Spafford's material wealth.

During the economic panic of 1873 he suffered even more loss and became concerned for his wife's health. In November he sent Anna and their four daughters to England, planning to join them shortly. Three weeks into their ocean voyage, a collision with another ship caused theirs to sink with 226 of the 308 passengers drowning in the space of 12 minutes. Spafford's four girls were among those lost; however, Anna was miraculously rescued.

Anna telegraphed Horatio with the tragic news: "Saved alone. What shall I do?" They were reunited and two years later they had a son, Horatio III, who died of scarlet fever at age 3. Within the next two years Bertha and Grace were born to them.

But Spafford's faith in God had begun to falter. He became a universalist, believing in Purgatory and eventually leaving the Presbyterian church after a scandal in which he falsely accused Rev. William C. Young of mishandling church finances. After Spafford was proven wrong, the congregation supported Pastor Young and Spafford left the church "white with anger," never to return.

He and a small following built a small chapel on his property, calling themselves "The Overcomers." He taught that hell does not exist, became obsessed with the date of Christ's second coming, and claimed to receive special messages from God.

Eventually, Spafford and his followers moved to Jerusalem, convinced they would be the only ones in the world who were truly prepared for Christ's return. Kate Uttinger, a member of this Jerusalem Colony, wrote that mothers were separated from their children and those who left were publicly shamed and excommunicated. In addition, Anna also claimed special revelation from God as she abolished marriage until she found an advantageous match for one of her daughters. In 1888 Horatio Spafford died of malaria in Jerusalem.

How are we as believers to interpret this cautionary tale? We must let Scripture instruct us as we go back to our foundation in God and His revelation in Holy Scripture.
