Testimony by June Yamamoto

As my husband and I were raising our 4 young children, we were not Christian. We were normal in the ways of the world, but ignorant of the ways of Christ.

We started our children off at Pukalani Baptist Preschool. As school parents we received a monthly church newsletter. And like the weekly newsletter that we are receiving during this Corona pandemic, page 1 featured the "Pastor's Pen." In 1992, Pastor Paul wrote about his trip to Washington DC along with his son Jon, where they attended Bill Gothard's "Basic Life Principles" Conference. The title "Basic Life Principles" sparked my interest, especially because in that same article, Pastor Paul mentioned that he plans to take each of his other 4 children, as they become age appropriate, to this conference. I pondered, "If the Pastor's children need to attend such a workshop, imagine how much more, we as lay people, need something like this?" I filed away the newsletter for future reference.

During March of 1993, Pastor again writes on that topic, this time announcing that Bill Gothard is bringing his conference to Honolulu in June of that year. To make a long story short, my son Ross, my daughter Jaclyn and I attended. The week long conference was held Monday through Friday, 7p to 10p, and on Saturday, all day. From the first time that I was in the audience until the last, I sat on edge of my seat, not wanting to miss any part of what was being said. It was as though Bill Gothard was speaking directly to me.

Then one night, Mr. Gothard asked the audience to bow their heads and listen for a question: "Imagine that you were traveling by bus, and God's team sat on the right side of the bus and the other team sat on the left. By a show of hands, how many of you would sit on the right? For those who raised their hands, repeat this prayer with me. . .And if you prayed that prayer, tell your Pastor or tell the person that you came with." Even before that question was asked, I already knew that I wanted this God and His Word. But when Bill Gothard asked the question, I was too prideful to raise my hand. Prayer was foreign to me. That evening, I prayed with Mr. Gothard out of curiosity, but was too embarrassed to admit that I did. "After all," I irritatingly thought, "what's the big deal, who really cares what I want or think?" And I hoped that they would soon get on with the meeting!

In the weeks following that life changing conference, Pastor Paul held a 6 month long Bible study. 7 topics were covered, one of which was, "Asking for Forgiveness". God immediately convicted me of the 3 people whom I most needed to ask for forgiveness: my Husband, my Mom, and a coworker. There were others, but these 3 were at the top of my list. As much as I hesitated to submit to His will regarding this, if God's Word was true, then I could accomplish this through Christ who strengthens me (Phil. 4:13) and I could rely on God to turn evil into good (Gen. 50:20). I prayed for His direction and timing as to how and when to ask these individuals for forgiveness.

At the proper time, the Lord provided the right circumstances, one at a time, for me to ask for forgiveness. And being faithful to His Word, in God's timing, He blessed each of our relationships in a manner that was exceedingly, abundantly above all that I could ask for or imagine. By 1999, both my Husband and my Mom had accepted Christ. All glory to Him!

Having seen God make those relationships beautiful in His time, back in the decade of the 1990's, has given me great confidence in the Lord and has caused me to realize that not only do I need Him during the storms of life, but in all the days of my life. Since then, I relied on Him and His Word to direct my path through most situations, some successfully, and some unsuccessfully. The later is not due to God's error because His Ways are indisputable. By far, the one most difficult situation to navigate was the passing of my husband in 2017. Because of my grief, it was easy to feel cheated by God or to be angry at Him and those thoughts did cross my mind. But I challenged myself not to go there, because of the Biblical truths which I had been experiencing since the days of the Bill Gothard Conference, and because of the Godly mentors at PBC who speak His Word in all sincerity and love. I have chosen to lean on Him for comfort and peace. And He has given me His beauty for ashes.

In closing, I would like to leave you with a Scripture from Col. 2:2-3 (TLB, NKJV): "This is what I have asked of God for you: that you will be encouraged and your hearts will be knit together by strong ties of love, and that you will have the rich experience of knowing Christ. . .in whom are all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge."
