A Conversation Overheard by Laura Newell

"How was your weekend?"

"It was fine. I got caught up on laundry, gardening, and I got to worship the Lord, too."

"That's good. I'm glad you came to jail today. I had a hard weekend."

"What happened?"

"Some of the girls got into a big argument about whether we should go to the Jehovah Witness class. Can you tell me the difference between their Bible and yours?"

"Well, the Witness bible claims to say some things God's Word doesn't say."

"Like what?"

"Check out John 1:1, that's the Gospel of John. The New World Translation of Holy Scriptures says, 'In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was a god.' But God's Word doesn't use the term 'a god.' It's God Himself. In other words, they don't believe that Jesus Christ is God in flesh, Emmanuel. That's who we celebrate at Christmas, right? And if Jesus is just Michael the archangel reincarnated, as Witnesses claim, He is not the Lamb of God who's worthy to take away my sin."

"But don't all Christians disagree about certain points?"

"It's true there are passages in Scripture that get translated differently. For example, 38% of

'American evangelicals' think they can earn heaven by their good works; in fact, many people believe that."

"Isn't that true?"

"Read Ephesians 2:8-9 with me: 'For by grace you have been saved through faith and that (faith) is not from yourself; it is the gift of God, not of works, so no one should boast.' What is God saying?"

"That faith is a gift from God?"

"Right. Think about the difference between a gift and a reward."

"That's a big difference!"

"Yeah, the difference between the truth and a lie."

"Hmm... What else do they say?"

"Well, look at John 1:3: 'All things were made by Him (Jesus), and without Him nothing was made that was made.' In other words, Christ created the world and everything in it. Genesis 1 tells us that the Father, Son, and Holy Spirit were all together at the miracle of creation. Strangely enough, 68%

of 'American evangelicals' believe that Jesus is the first and greatest creature created by God which is what the Witnesses say. If John 1:3 is true, how could Jesus be created? In fact, He's eternal; otherwise, Christ wouldn't be God in the flesh."

"Ok, I think I'm following you. Any other differences?"

"Yes, but let's talk about just one more. Jehovah Witnesses, along with 52% of so-called Evangelicals, believe that while everyone sins, most people are good by nature."

"Well, I think that's true. Isn't it?"

"Do 'filthy rags' ring a bell? No? Look at Isaiah 64:6-7. What do you think?"

"Oh, oh. Don't you think that's kinda harsh?"

"Notice the prophet says we're all unclean? That means no one is fit to be in God's presence. My best isn't good enough for God because it's not perfect and He is perfect. That's my good stuff, not my bad stuff. In fact, Isaiah repeats it three times for people like me who are slow: God is holy, holy, holy, and since we've all sinned, we are unholy in His sight.

"I never thought about God's holiness."

"Most folks know that God is love, but they've forgotten He's holy. Since no one is perfect, we all need Jesus, the perfect Son of God, the perfect Son of Man. I once had a Witness tell me, 'Laura, do you know where we get our converts? From churches like yours.'"

"That's crazy, isn't it? Well, I've sure got a lot of learn, but I want to know God better."

"Me, too!"

Helen Fukagawa's Testimony

I grew up in a plantation camp in Pukalani called Corn Mill Camp. It was located where the Pukalani Fire Station is currently situated. There were about 30 families living in this camp, all of whom were employed by the Maui Pineapple Company. So there were a lot of children growing up in this camp. My family comprised of my dad, mom (both of whom were Buddhist), and 6 children (4 boys, 2 girls). My sister and I were the only ones who attended church. Right in the middle of the camp was a clubhouse which was used for activities such as Boy Scouts meetings, camp gatherings, Christmas events and other various meetings; and, at the age of 6 or 7, this is where I first attended Vacation Bible School led by missionary Alda Grayson of Pukalani Baptist Mission. The pastor at this mission at that time was James Sanbei. Thus began my “going to church journey” at Pukalani Baptist Mission which was later commissioned into Pukalani Baptist Church.

Growing up into my teenage years, I began attending church functions with other girls starting with Sunbeams, Gas, YWA, VBS, and various youth activities. I can still remember missionary Bertie Lee Kendrick and Amy Murray leading us in Sunbeams, Gas, and YWA. As I entered high school, I remember PBC hosting revival services. They would invite various guests from Oahu or the mainland to speak at these services. At that time PBC had a nice group of youth, both boys and girls, attending church; and that could have been one of the reasons why I attended those services – to check out the guys who would be there (hee! Hee!). It was at these revival services that my heart would start thumping away when the invitation was open for those who wanted to accept Jesus as their Savior. I actually dreaded those times because I knew that the Lord was speaking to me but I just could not find the courage to step out and walk down the aisle, until one night Katherine Sanbei, our pastor's wife, took my sister and I aside before the service began and talked to us about making a decision to accept Jesus into our hearts. My sister wasn't ready to take that step but I said yes, I would like to. Mrs. Sanbei even arranged to have me sit up in the very front pew with her oldest daughter next to me to keep me calm and encouraged.

After high school and beyond, I started going to church more often participating in various activities and ministries until going to church became very important to me. I would tell my family who visited often from California why I couldn't go to the beach with them because I wanted to attend Sunday School and worship service. Sometimes I know it didn't sit well with them. As I close, I just want to acknowledge my parents and say thank you to them for standing by me; they never discouraged me, scolded me or even objected to my attending PBC throughout all these years.
