GOD PREPARED BEFOREHAND By Laura Newell

"For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that (grace/faith) is not from yourself; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast." Ephesians 2:8-9

"For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them". Ephesians 2:10

Whether I'm in Zambia, China, or Pukalani, I encourage women to memorize this foundational truth of our faith. Ephesians 2 is the perfect place to begin understanding God and His plan. Ruby memorized these verses many long years ago. This week before our Tuesday morning Bible class we were sharing prayer requests and those included Ruby, of course.

June K shared with us that when she thinks of Ruby, she remembers Tabatha (aka Dorcas) in Acts 9; I was surprised because that similarity had come to my mind as well. Luke informs us that "At Joppa (now called Jaffa, about 38 miles NW of Jerusalem) there was a certain disciple named Tabitha, which is translated Dorcas. This woman was full of good works and charitable deeds which she did. But it happened in those days that she became sick and died... The disciples heard that Peter was there, so they sent two men to him, imploring him not to delay in coming to them. Then Peter arose and went with them, and when he had come, they brought him to the upper room. All the widows stood by him, weeping and showing the tunics and garments which Dorcas had made while she was with them. But Peter put them all out, and knelt down and prayed. And turning to the body he said, 'Tabitha, arise.' She opened her eyes, and when she saw Peter she sat up. Then he gave her his hand and lifted her up; when he had called the saints and widows, he presented her alive."

Can you imagine that? Granted, the details are not identical; however, there are definitely similarities between Tabitha and Ruby. No, God did not raise Ruby from the dead, but He surely spared her life and is slowly but surely bringing her back to life! Instead of sewing clothing for many at PBC, Ruby searched Maui stores as only a woman can do, buying blouses, vests, slacks, slippers, and other garments for us. She has the uncanny knack of knowing just what size each woman is!

Some of you may recall the mega garage sale we had years ago in the then empty lot next to Ray and June Yamamoto's home. Garret put up a huge tent for us, brought cold drinks, and our ladies worked for hours, prepping and selling items to raise money for Chinese orphans. Who was our fearless leader? None other than Ruby, and God blessed us with \$1500.

How many garage sales did Ruby host in order to send her neighbor kids to summer camp? Plenty!

Believe it or not, there's a spare bedroom at the Yip's that stores various goods to be given away. In fact, just a couple years ago one of our ladies was in financial stress. What did Ruby

do? Plan a garage sale and an amazing amount of money was raised that day. We jokingly call her our "Garage Sale Queen." I know many of you can tell a "Ruby story."

The first year we took a team of women to Zambia, Ruby and Jade were on that team, and Ruby saw how the children in the slums loved "sugar." Each time we partnered with Seeds of Hope, Ruby sent big bags of candies for the kids, and they came from everywhere to get her candies.

One day Ruby dropped by the church office to give our former church secretary a lovely lacey vest which she enjoyed so much that she wore it often. One day in Costco, June ran into Ruby and her sister; they looked at one another and all three burst out laughing because Ruby's sister had given the vest to Ruby who turned around and gave it to June.

Just this week I received an e-mail from Dr. Sheena Lee in Papua New Guinea, thanking Ruby for encouraging her when she was low. Leaving Maui to begin ministry on the other side of the world, Sheena was feeling like Abraham leaving Ur except with no family going along to help. Ruby unexpectedly showed up at Maui Airport with a hug, a prayer, and a lovely lei. Sheena's heart was so blessed to be reminded that she, in fact, was not alone.

Lest you misunderstand, we don't put Ruby on any pedestal. God gets all the glory because Ephesians 2:10 says, "We are God's masterpiece created in Christ Jesus to do the good works which God prepared beforehand for us to do." Isn't that amazing? God created us, drew us with cords of love, saved our souls, and planned those good deeds He wanted us to do, and that's just what Ruby does, day by day, week by week, month by month. How I praise God for my sister Ruby!

It became apparent as I grew and also struggled in my walk with the Lord and my marriage that I really needed Christian women friends. Ones to walk beside me, support me and show me what it meant to be a Woman of Faith. The Lord has so graciously and faithfully provided me with solid role models over the years! One story comes to mind...shortly after joining the church, we had a fellowship lunch. I was new and shy and rather uncomfortable. Marje Sado pulled up a chair and asked me if I wanted to join her at the WMU House Party on Oahu. I quickly said "SURE!!", and then had to ask her what WMU meant. We have been friends since that day.

As time went on, the Lord brought so many incredible women into my life, and they have become lifelong friends. When my marriage dissolved, I was shattered. Laurie, Beth and so many others would come over to chat and make sure I was ok. My years as a single Mom and my meeting and

dating Steve were all supported by strong, kind women who lifted me up in prayer. My wedding to Steve and marriage of 18 years were never without strong connections to my Sisters in Christ.

4 years ago when Steve was unexpectedly called Home to be with the Lord, these women literally held me up, physically, emotionally and spiritually.
