Women's Tuesday morning Bible class will begin a new series on July 14, 9-10:30. We will be using Jerry Bridges "Trusting God" (subtitled "Even When Life Hurts"). This will be my third time to go through the biblical principles presented, and I can hardly wait to start it all over again. One of the reasons it's so good is because the book is packed full of God's Word.

I'd like to share some excerpts, some of my personal favorites, to encourage women of all ages to join with us for prayer and Bible study this coming Tuesday morning. All are most welcome.

"If we want to live less stressful lives, we must learn to live with a single agenda, God's agenda. We tend to live under two agendas, ours and God's, and the tension between them sets up stress."

"If you stop to think about it, you will realize that most godly character traits can only be developed through adversity. The kind of love that gives freely of itself at great cost to itself can only be learned when we are confronted with situations that call forth sacrificial love. The fruit of the Spirit that is called joy cannot be learned in the midst of circumstances that produce mere 'natural' happiness."

"If we are to experience peace in our souls in times of adversity, we must come to the place where we truly believe that God's ways are simply beyond us and stop asking Him why or even trying to determine it ourselves."

"God is completely sovereign. God is infinite in wisdom. God is perfect in love."

"Prayer is the most tangible expression of trust in God."

My journey with God began when I was enrolled at the Pukalani Baptist Preschool. I started attending Sunday School regularly at around 5 years old. Although my parents were Buddhists, I was allowed to attend different activities such as Vacation Bible School, GA's (girl's missions club), and Children's Camp. Church was a happy place; the people there were kind and welcoming. I was learning a lot about God and the Bible, but I didn't know that I could have a personal relationship with God.

During the summer when I was about 12 or 13, my life changed at an evening church service for the youth. At the end of the

message, the guest preacher urged all of us to invite Jesus to come into our lives. Although I had been attending church for many years, it was different that night. I was a little afraid of how intense the speaker was. To my surprise, my younger brother Alan walked forward to pray with the speaker. He looked happy. Something started happening in my heart. I realized there was an empty place in my life that I hadn't felt before, and I finally understood that only Jesus could fill that emptiness. It was almost a relief to walk towards the stage to pray to ask Jesus to forgive me of my sins, and to invite Him into my heart. I was overwhelmed with a deep peace and joy and excited that Jesus was now living in my heart.

I've been a Christian for about 50 years now but I still have much to learn in my walk with Him and building His character. Being a follower of Jesus is the best decision I've made. God has helped me in my marriage, parenting, career, retirement and caregiving. I'm grateful that God is always loving, faithful, and patient with me through my mistakes or not obeying Him. The trials I've been through have caused me to seek God more, and to deepen my relationship with Him.

God's Word has always been important, but over the years, they have become richer, more meaningful, and powerful to me. I'm working on letting His Word renew my mind. Pastor Paul has mentioned many times in his messages about choosing to dwell on God's Word and His truths, and not our feelings. Philippians 4: 4-7 helps me when I worry. "Rejoice in the Lord, again I will say rejoice. Let your gentle spirit be known to all men. The Lord is near. Be anxious for nothing, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving, let your requests be known to God. And

the peace of God which surpasses all comprehension, will guard your hearts and your mind in Christ Jesus."

Pray w/ us that she can get a haircut ASAP; with that she'll feel almost human again. Her physical therapist, Lianne, said she'll start doing PT, OT, and speech therapy for an hour each daily, so let's pray for increased physical strength and stamina.
