This Sunday, August 30, 2020 is **"MISSION DIGNITY"** Sunday. It is an essential Ministry that our Denomination (Southern Baptist Convention) has supported for many years. It is a program designed to provide additional financial support for our retired Southern Baptist Pastors & Wives who have insufficient funds to survive. They have given their entire lives pastoring smaller churches and have not been able to care for their retirement needs.

Here is a portion of the 2020 Annual Report of the <u>**GUIDESTONE FINANCIAL RESOURCES**</u> of the Southern Baptist Convention.

At the very heart of GuideStone is the relief ministry Mission:Dignity®. In 2019, <u>Mission:Dignity</u> had its best fund-raising year to date, raising some \$9.7 million for relief efforts for retired pastors and, in most cases, their widows. Thanks to an endowment set up many years ago that covers administrative costs, 100 percent of gifts to Mission:Dignity go to help these good and godly servants. Almost <u>1,700</u> <u>individuals</u> in desperate financial need are able to receive benefits from GuideStone's Mission:Dignity ministry.

When GuideStone was founded 102 years ago, its visionary first leader, <u>William</u> <u>Lunsford</u>, promised the messengers (delegates from Individual Churches like PBC) of the Southern Baptist Convention that this ministry would be there to serve them (the Pastors). "Give yourself wholeheartedly to the work. We'll stand back of you," he said. "If you fall in the work, we'll care for you; if you die, we will not allow your family to suffer. If you grow old in the work, we'll comfort you in your declining years."

Through a century of change, expansion and growth, GuideStone has chosen to remain true to its founding and provide relief for Southern Baptist ministers and denominational employees. Since 2014, the neediest Mission:Dignity recipients saw their monthly grant amount grow to \$450 for individuals and \$600 for couples. Qualified recipients receiving the largest payouts must have at least 25 years of salaried Southern Baptist ministerial service and must meet guidelines for income and assets. Eligible recipients with at least 10 years of full-time, salaried Southern Baptist service can receive \$225 per month if single, and couples can receive \$300.

I personally remember several Pastors in my Childhood and Youth. But I especially remember Pastor Bratton, who was my Pastor while I was in college in Arkansas. He was a Godly Man who was warm and loving to this college kid from Hawaii. Under his ministry God called me to dedicate

my life to the Ministry. His counsel and encouragement really started me on the pathway that I'm on today.

Nothing happened overnight, but slowly but surely there was some change. My students didn't change, but God began to pour some of His patience and kindness into my heart for them. I could feel the change and I even began to look forward to preparing for that class.

Years later I got a phone call from another city. It was one of the students from that class who said, "Congratulations!" I hesitated and asked what was up with that. Here's what I heard:

"I miss you and want to tell you that we just had a baby boy, and we want you to give him an English name. Will you do that?" I smiled and remembered that class and readily agreed to name him.

After we hung up, I began to thank God that whatever I lack, He has. His agape love is perfect and that's what I need. He is willing and able to pour out His love into my hearts for others. Even now, years later, I find myself praying a similar prayer, asking for His love to flow to me and through me so I can represent Him well. How precious is God's love!
